This program may be used by individuals with disabilities for any transportation need: medical, business, shopping, airport, etc. Both handicapped and non-handicap vehicles are available. This program is run through a grant from the Federal Transit Administration and the Nebraska Dept. of Roads. ENOA matches these grants with funds received from passenger fares and country revenue. Fares: 1—10 miles...\$3, 11-20 miles... \$6, 21-40 miles...\$7, 41-60 miles...\$8 and over 61 miles...\$9.

STEPHEN'S CENTER

We've had a great response from parishioners willing to provide meals for up to 150 people at the Stephen Center on the first Friday of each month. We need volunteers for just 2 dates in 2023. Our most pressing need is January 6th and the other date available is May 5th. St. Joseph is reimbursing food expenses up to \$300 per month for those willing to prepare and serve the food. Groups are served at the center beginning at 5pm and is finished around 6:30 pm. Four to seven volunteers, age 5 and older, are able to serve when accompanied by an adult. We are expected to provide the main course and providing desserts is helpful. The Stephen Center is able to provide salads and drinks.
