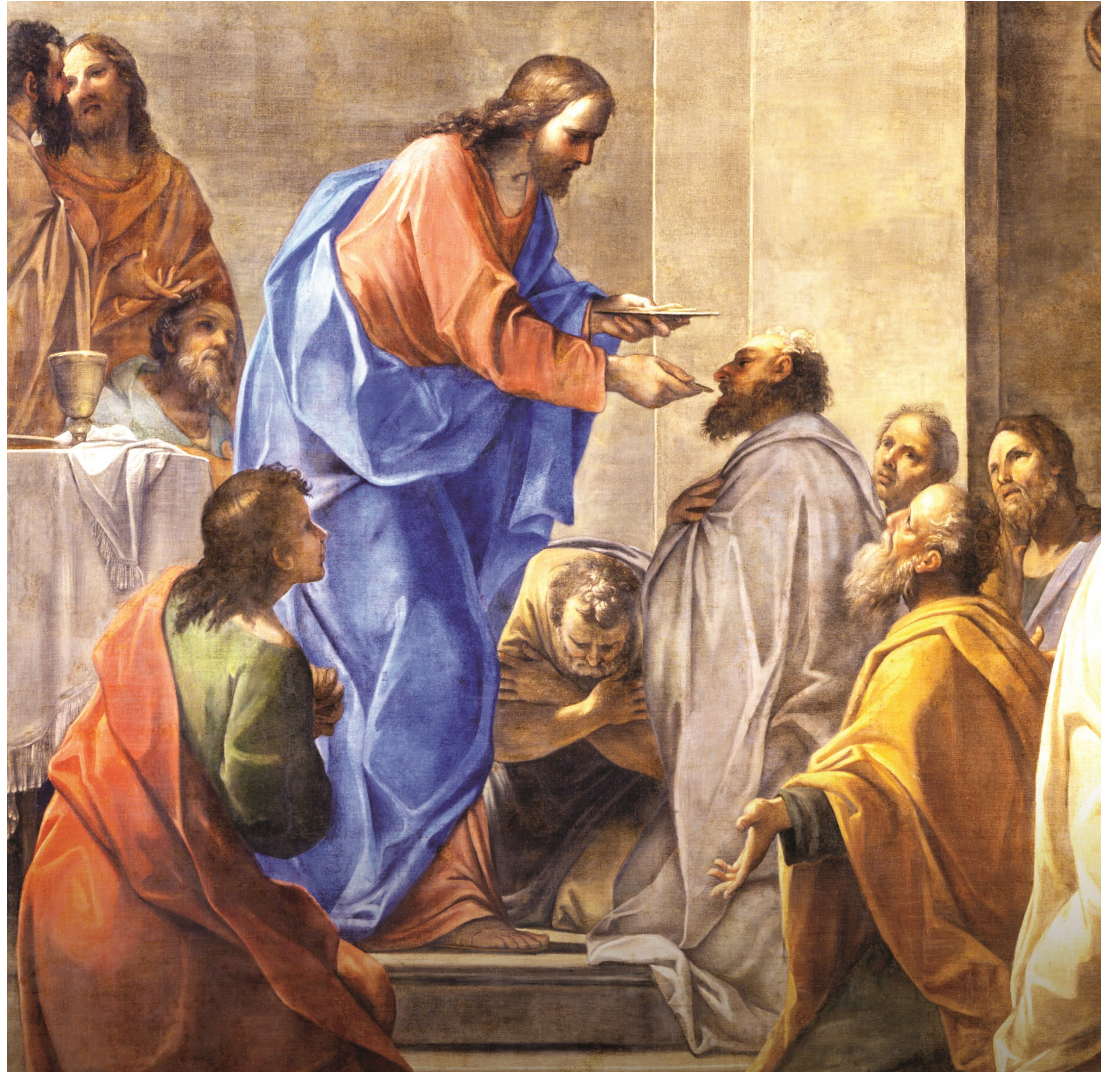

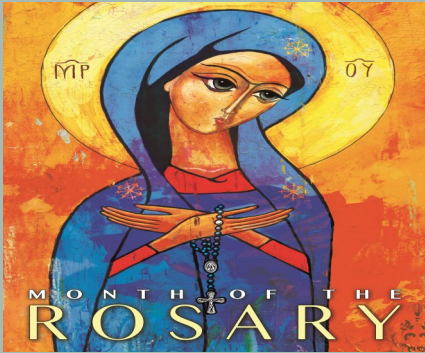

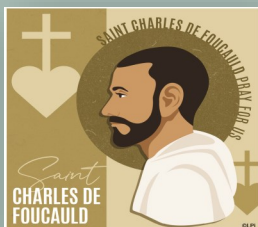

THE ROSARY

ROSARY - "ROSARIUM" IN LATIN - MEANS A CROWN OF ROSES



Mary, Mother of God, Pray for us.

One of the most reassuring elements of the Catholic faith is the Communion of Saints. Some of the greatest indications of this communion of saints come in the form of Marian apparitions. These are moments when the Blessed Virgin Mary appears to us here on earth, letting us know that her prayers for us are being offered to God. It also reaffirms the fact that the Blessed Mother always points to her son.

Our Lady of Fatima 1917

The Marian apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima occurred in 1917 in Portugal, where she appeared to three children, Sister Lucia and her cousins, Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto. Her messages, particularly calling people to pray the Rosary, have profoundly impacted countless lives, including St. John Paul II. On October 13, 1917, over 70,000 people witnessed the "Dancing of the Sun," leading to many conversions. The Feast of Our Lady of Fatima is celebrated on May 13.

Our Lady of Guadalupe 1531

In 1531, St. Juan Diego received visions of Our Lady of Guadalupe near Mexico City and was instructed to ask the bishop of Mexico to build a church at the site. The bishop of Mexico wanted proof, so as a sign, he presented out-of-season flowers and a miraculous image of Our Lady on his tilma, which remains intact to this day. Our Lady of Guadalupe is venerated by pilgrims, recognized as the patroness of the Americas, and her feast day is celebrated on December 12



Our Lady of Knock 1879

On August 21, 1879, in Knock, Ireland, fifteen people witnessed an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, and St. John the Apostle, along with an altar displaying the Paschal Lamb and a cross. The figures remained silent as the witnesses prayed the Rosary for two hours, during which it rained, yet the ground at the apparition site stayed dry. The Feast of Our Lady of Knock is celebrated on August 21, and St. John Paul II visited the shrine on its 100th anniversary

Our Lady of LaSalette 1846

In 1846, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to two children, Maximin Giraud and Melanie Calvat, in the French Alps as Our Lady of LaSalette. She was seen crying and spoke about the need for the conversion of sinners, urging respect for the Holy Name of Jesus and keeping the Sabbath holy. This single apparition carried a message of hope, which Pope St. John Paul II reaffirmed on its 150th anniversary. A canonical coronation of her image took place in 1879, and her feast is celebrated annually on September 19.



October is the Month of the Rosary

Throughout October, many Catholics engage in praying the rosary more frequently, participate in special devotions, and reflect on the mysteries of the rosary as a way to deepen their spiritual life and connection to Mary. . Take time this October to pray a rosary and to learn more about our devotion to Mary, the mother of our Lord.
