

First Reading

(Dn 12:1-3)

The prophet Daniel foresaw a time of great distress and ultimate judgement for the living and the dead. Who supports you when you are feeling anxious or are deeply worried?

Second Reading

(Heb 10:11-14)

The author of the Hebrews emphasizes Jesus's death as the final offering for the forgiveness of sins, making us "perfect forever" in eternal life. What do you find most curious about the idea of being perfect in eternal life?

Gospel Reading

(Mark 13:24-32) Jesus speaks to his disciples about the signs that will accompany his Second Coming, even though only God the Father knows the exact time. How should one best prepare for this unknown future?
