Elizabeth calls Mary "blessed" because she believed and trusted in the Lord. Are there people in your life who model such trust and faith in God?


## **BIBLE IN A YEAR Podcast and Small Group**

Don't miss out on this opportunity to finally understand how all the pieces of the Bible fit together to tell an amazing story that continues in your life today!





# What can we learn about the "Hail Mary" in the larger context of Sacred Scripture?

The "Hail Mary is one of the most well-known prayers of our Catholic Faith. What is remarkable about it is that it's taken directly from Scripture. Its heart originates from the angel's greeting to Mary: "Hail, full of grace, the

Lord is with you!" (Luke 1:28). The other central part is Elizabeth's response to Mary in the Visitation: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" (Luke 1:42). The rest of this prayer is packed

The promises of the Old Testament resonate as

with biblical meaning. Dr. Andrew Swafford explains how the verses of this prayer we pray the "Hail Mary." reflect important events in the Old Testament. Let's take a closer look!

## "The Lord Is With You"

This phrase signals a momentous stage in salvation history. To put that in context, let's note that this same phrase is used with Moses, Joshua, and Jeremiah as they receive their missions from God. It also indicates that the

"yes" of the individual will have great consequences for the unfolding of God's great plan of salvation. With this in mind, Gabriel's words to Mary ("the Lord is with you") should resonate with the reader, making us aware of the pivotal moment.

# "Blessed Are You Among Women"

Words like these also have biblical precedents, including when a heroic woman defeats an enemy of God's people by striking a mortal blow to the enemy's head. In Judges 4:21, Jael drives a tent peg into enemy general Sisera's temple, for which she is praised: "Most blessed of women be Jael" (Judges 5:24). Likewise, Judith beheads the general Holofernes, with Uzziah saying, "O daughter, you are blessed by the Most High God above all women on earth" (Judith 13:18). The phrase also is tied to the proto-evangelium, the promise of redemption:

I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel. (Genesis 3:15)

This verse foretells a time when a woman and her seed would crush the head of Satan, ultimately referring to Mary and Jesus. Mary, the New Eve, will join in the work of the New Adam, Jesus.

Mary's participation in God's mission begins with her great "yes" at the Annunciation and continues in her faithfulness at the Cross, where she unites her will with God's will and offers her son to the Father on behalf of all humanity. In the "Hail Mary," we recognize Mary's continual maternal love and prayers for each of us as she earnestly seeks to lead us to her son.


