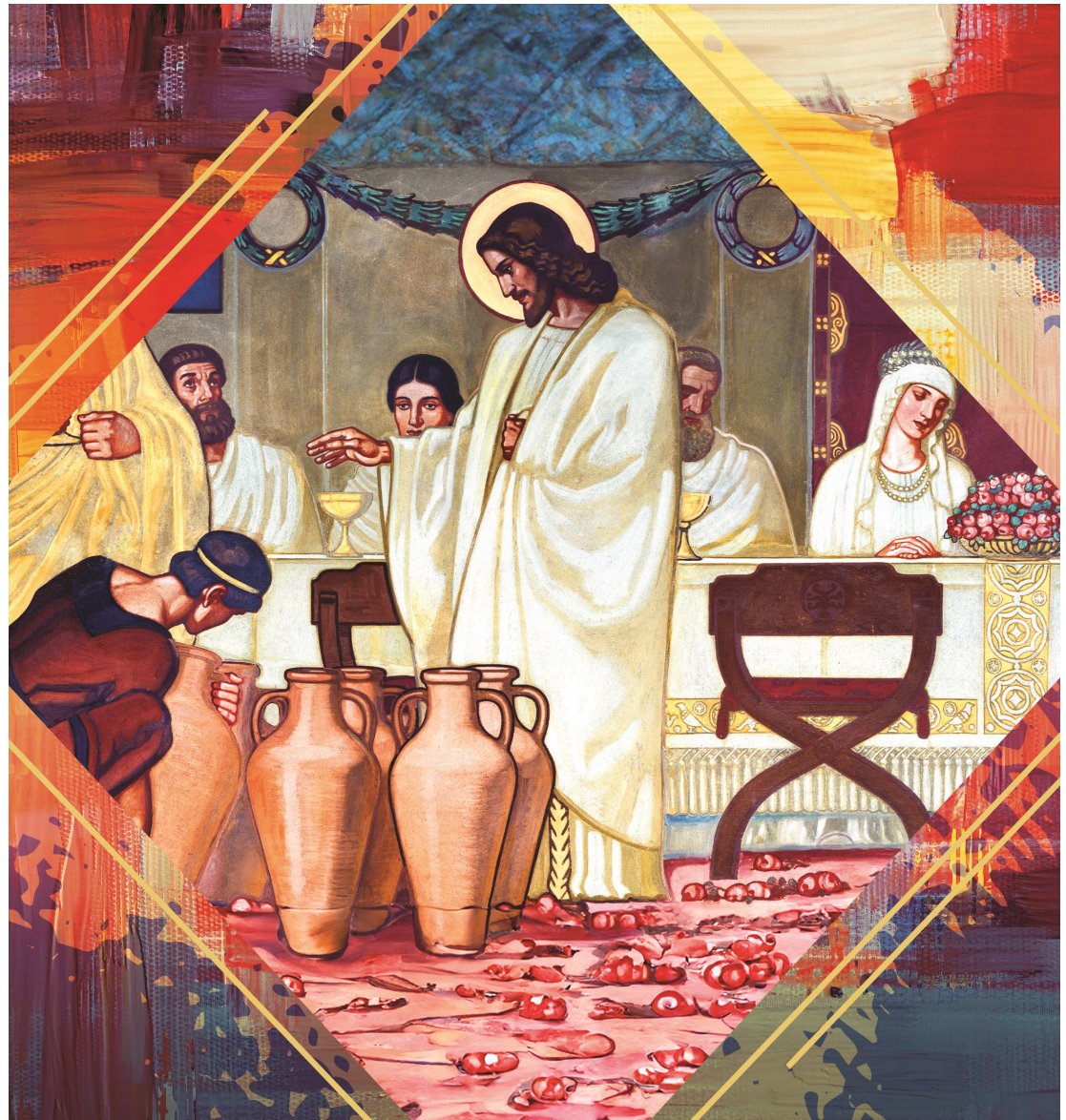

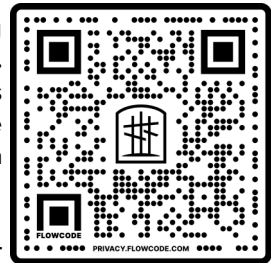

Get Safe Environment Certified!

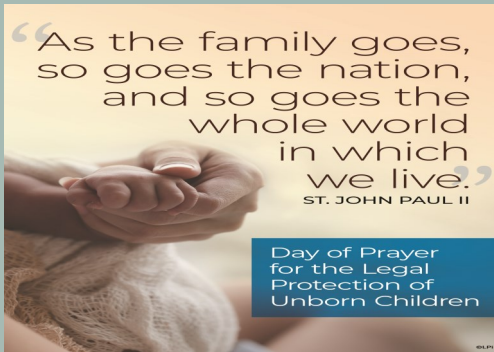

Scholarships Awarded by the Knight of Columbus Council

The William Biernbaum Knights of Columbus Scholarship is worth \$1,500. The remaining scholarships are for \$1,000. The Knights will fund a maximum of five scholarships. Preference will be given to active St. Joseph Knights of Columbus family members.

To qualify, you must graduate from high school or complete home schooling in the 2024-25 academic year. You also must be accepted at any two- or four-year college or vocational school. **Application deadline is Sunday, March 9 at 10 a.m.**

BIBLE IN A YEAR Podcast and Small Group

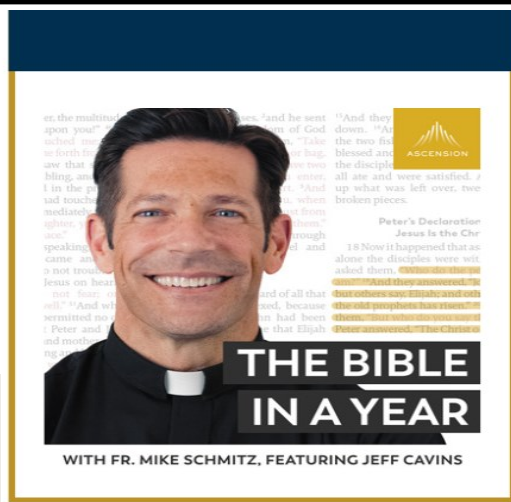

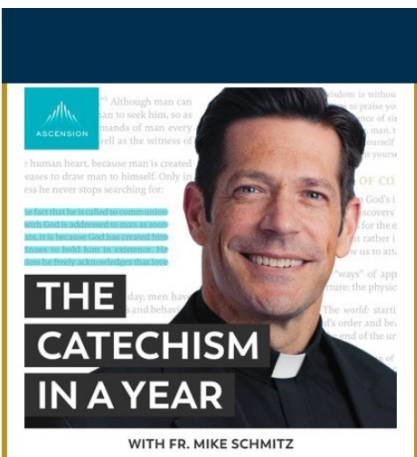

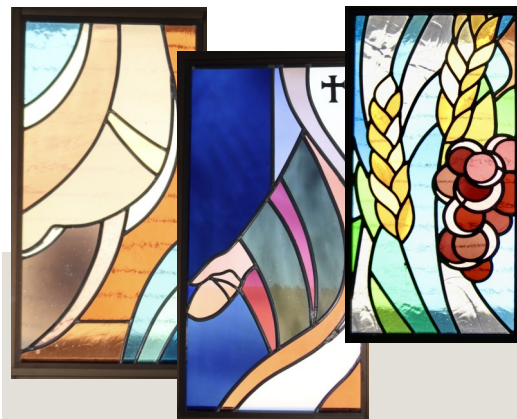
