

Dear St. Joseph Parishioners,

Next weekend, we'll interrupt the Sundays of Ordinary Time with the celebration of the Presentation of the Lord. This feast falls forty days after Christmas, always on February 2nd. Since it falls this year on a Sunday, it takes the place of the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. It commemorates the day that Jesus was presented in the Temple at Jerusalem. Part of the ritual of the day is the blessing of candles. The 9am Mass will begin with the candle blessing at 8:55am. If you would like to bring candles from home for the blessing, please feel free to do so.

Next Monday is the Feast of St. Blaise, so the blessing of throats will take place after Mass both that day and on the following weekend.


