

St. Joseph has Eucharistic Adoration from 7 AM to 9 PM on the first Wednesday of every month. During the Lent and Easter seasons, we will also have Eucharistic Adoration from 7 PM - 9 PM on March 17th, April 21st, May 19th.

#### Living out the Works of Mercy at St. Joseph

At St. Joseph, we are blessed with many ministries dedicated to serving others with compassion and faith. Rooted in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, these ministries strive to meet the physical and spiritual needs of our parish and community. From preparing meals and visiting the sick to supporting those in need through charitable outreach, these ministries serve as the hands and heart of Christ in the world.

Some of our Works of Mercy Ministries include the Prayer Chain, Care Chain, Funeral Luncheons, Feeding the Flock, and our Monthly Charity Corner.

#### **Feeding the Flock**

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat..." Matthew 25:35-37

Beginning this Lenten season, St. Joseph will launch a new ministry—Feeding the Flock—dedicated to preparing and freezing main course meals and baked goods for parishioners in need. This parish-wide initiative welcomes volunteers to help with meal preparation and delivery as needed.

Our plan is to gather in the parish hall kitchen once a month—or every six weeks, depending on demand—to prepare and freeze a variety of soups, casseroles, baked sweet breads, and cookies, all of which store well. These frozen meals can then be supplemented with fresh vegetables, salads, and other items to support parishioners experiencing significant life events, such as the birth of a child, recovery from surgery, health challenges, or other special needs.

We will begin scheduling kitchen dates toward the end of March and into early April. In the meantime, we welcome donations of shelf-stable pantry items or grocery gift cards in any denomination to help purchase fresh ingredients and meat. The Ladies Guild has generously designated Charity Corner donations for the month of March to stock our pantry.

#### Items Needed:

- 11b bags of brown sugar (4)
- 1 lb bags of white sugar (3)

- Baking powder (1 container)
