

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear St. Joseph Parishioners,

This weekend, we welcome Fr. Bitrus Jilangs, a priest of the Diocese of Maiduguri in Nigeria. Historically, this is the region of Nigeria most attacked by the terrorist group Boko Haram. The Catholic population is less than 3% of the total, but it nearly the same size as the Catholic population of the Archdiocese of Omaha, but in an area of 7.2 million people. They have only 65 priests, which is less than half of what we have, meaning that access to the sacraments there can be quite difficult. I am not sure what Fr. Bitrus will visit about, but he is coming from a true mission land of the Church. Envelopes for the mission appeal collection will be available next weekend at the Masses.
