



## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear St. Joseph Parishioners,

In the coming days, we will all be receiving letters from Archbishop McGovern about the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. Our goal is \$28,652.07. That amount is determined by a percentage of the six-year average of our Sunday collections. It is the same formula for every parish. I hope that you will join me in supporting this. Practically speaking, St. Joseph realizes a big benefit from this in that 80% of my salary and benefits are paid for out the budget of the chancery office of the archdiocese. In other words, that amount does not hit our parish budget. Even if we meet our goal--which I am confident that we will--our realized benefit will be significantly higher. The Annual Appeal helps to support the works of the archdiocese that parishes cannot support on our own, such as support for Catholic Charities, vocations work, prison and jail ministry, Catholic media (including the new magazine), etc. It also supports infrastructure resources for smaller and midsized parishes, which St. Joseph's is. For example, the archdiocesan IT department provides managed services for our parish at a below-market rate, so we can contract with them for our security and IT needs and get the benefit of a very professional IT staff. When we updated our IT last year, that process was overseen by the managed services staff. So, in other words, we benefit tangibly from the Annual Appeal. Please join me in this effort if your resources make you able to do so.


