


This year, St. Joseph will also offer a small group gathering to reflect, share, and grow together through the *Waiting Well* journey. More information to follow!

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Six months of marriage preparation prior to your wedding is required by the Archdiocese. Contact the parish office to schedule your wedding date and marriage instruction.
