But, in reality, the Church is just made up of us. We've all got our struggles, our hopes and dreams, and all those concerns and thanksgivings that make up our lives. You follow Christ. He follows Christ. She follows Christ. That person over there follows Christ. I follow Christ. Some people are so close to Him that their lives reflect His peace and joy easily and readily. Others are still on the outskirts, and everywhere in between.

The beautiful part of this is that there is a path for everyone, even if it isn't the same map.
