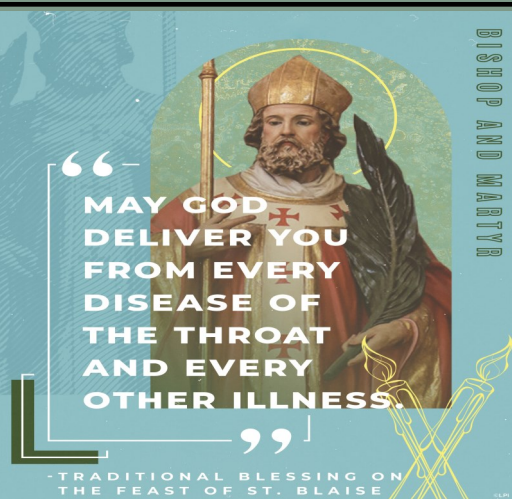
Would you like to lift others in prayer, or have someone's intention prayed for? Our Prayer Chain supports our parish family through the power of prayer.

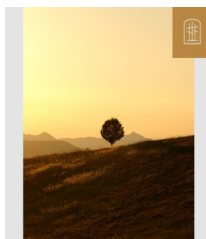
Parish Retreat: A Day of Recollection

Knights of Columbus & Ladies Guild Scholarships

Scholarship applications for St. Joseph's seniors are now available. The Ladies' Guild and the Knights of Columbus, each have their own application. Students may win either a Ladies' Guild scholarship or a Knights of Columbus scholarship, but not both. Applications for both Ladies Guild and Knights of Columbus can be found on St. Joseph's website www.stjosephspringfield.org.

The Ladies' Guild application is for children of St. Joseph's registered members and focuses on the student's involvement in the St. Joseph's community and service outside of St. Joseph. Ladies' Guild will award one \$1,500 scholarship and up to three \$1,000 scholarships. Once filled out, the application should be placed in an envelope labeled "Ladies' Guild Scholarship" and placed in the Ladies' Guild mailbox **by 10 p.m. on March 15, 2026**. SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Registered parishioners will need to contact the parish office to schedule a meeting for their baptism class. After the class is complete, you can schedule a date. Baptisms can take place during a weekend mass or after.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Six months of marriage preparation prior to your wedding is required by the Archdiocese. Contact the parish office to schedule your wedding date and marriage instruction.
